Background of the Department

The **Department of Political Science** of the University of the Philippines Diliman is proud of more than a century-long tradition of honor and excellence. It is the only one recognized by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) as a Center of Excellence in Political Science in the Philippines. As home to the largest number of full-time political science faculty in the Philippines with graduate degrees from reputable universities, it contributes to the distinction of the University of the Philippines as the only Philippine higher education institution ranked in the Quacquarelli Symonds' World University Ranking for the subject of Politics.

Program Overview

Our **Master in International Affairs (MIA)** program provides students with an understanding of contemporary international society, including the forces shaping and transforming it. Through the program, students can better understand contemporary international issues and problems, as well as the various strategies for responding to them. Students also develop a sense of importance for conceptual paradigms that guide the actions of individual leaders and institutions in the international arena. They likewise develop an appreciation for academic and policy-oriented research and are exposed to multidisciplinary and comparative approaches.

The program is practitioner-oriented and aims to provide professional preparation for those who plan to pursue careers in foreign service, international organizations, transnational corporations, or similar industries that require an International Relations background.

Admission Requirements

Scanned copies of the following documents shall be submitted via email.

- Application via a google form that will be uploaded during the application period.2. Original and complete Transcript of Records
- 3. Certificate of GWA
- 4. Original PSA-certified Birth Certificate (for Filipino citizens)
- 5. Three (3) recommendation letters from former professors and/or employers
- 6. Letter of application addressed to the Department Chair
- 7. A statement on research interest (800-1,000 words)
- 8. For non-UP graduates: Upon acceptance, a softcopy of the original Honorable Dismissal or Transfer Credentials from the immediately preceding higher education institution

The following are the minimum requirement for admission into the program:

- 1. Bachelor's degree
- 2. General Weighted Average (GWA) of 2.0 or better for UP graduates or 1.75 or better for non-UP graduates;
- 3. Non-refundable fee of PhP100 for Filipino citizens, PhP200 for resident aliens, and US\$25 for foreigners. Payment procedures will be emailed to applicants at the end of the application period.
- 4. For those whose native language is not English, proof of English proficiency (e.g., a TOEFL score of 80 for the internet-based test or 550 for the paper-based test or IELTS Band 6.5), unless they earned degrees from institutions where English is the medium of instruction.
